International Telecommunications Union Telecom World 2006 Convention

The role of regulation in next generation networks was the topic of a panel featuring PURC Director Mark Jamison. The panel examined which role if any regulation might play in telecommunications as countries migrate towards increased broadband networks based on Internet technologies. He emphasized the need to consider the basic purposes of regulation in determining its role and that proper answers would vary across countries. The audience included 150 industry, policy makers and regulators from across the world. Several graduates of the PURC/World Bank international Training Program were in the audience, including Mr. Man Ho Au, a June 1997 alumnus who chaired the panel. Dr. Jamison also presented "Discounting Telephone Service: An Examination of Participation in Florida's Lifeline Program Using Panel Data" at Lingnan University in Hong Kong, China. The seminar examined the effectiveness of the program and summarized PURC's research.
